

## North Carolina's Death Penalty

Did you know?

- North Carolina has not executed anyone since 2006.
- Last year was the first year in the history of the State of North Carolina that no one was sentenced to die.
- The NC Racial Justice Act of 2009 calls for court reviews of racial bias in death penalty cases and has been reaffirmed in every case brought before the courts under the RJA.
- Efforts are underway to restart executions in North Carolina and to repeal the Racial Justice Act.
- So far, nearly 1,000 NC congregations, businesses, community groups and local governments have passed resolutions calling for North Carolina to repeal the death penalty.

Congregations and people of faith across North Carolina are coming together to call for repeal of the death penalty. Join the call.
