

**Opening Litany for Justice
Service of Repentance and Consecration
HKonJ People's Assembly
February 8, 2014**

One: Sisters and Brothers, God has called us to this day, to this place, for this moment. We come first in gratitude for the One who has called us together.

All: Holy One, we know what you require of us: to do justice, to love mercy, to walk humbly with you. We come in gratitude, asking your blessing.

One: We have come from many different places, backgrounds, and beliefs.

All: We come with one voice and one hope: that God's justice might roll down like the waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream.

One: As people of faith, we give witness: we cannot claim to love our neighbor while refusing them access to healthcare or a living wage or a vote.

All: We call upon our leaders to do what is moral, what is just, what is right. We pray for them, that their eyes shall be opened to see their neighbors, to love them as God loves.

One: In the face of those "who make iniquitous decrees, who write oppressive statutes, to turn aside the needy from justice and rob the poor of their rights,"

All: We will not be afraid. We will not be silent!

One: In the face of those who "devise mischief by decree," who blame those who suffer, who cast as enemy our teachers, immigrants, people of color,

All: In the face of those who would deepen divisions of race, sexual orientation, and class: we will not be afraid. We will not be silent!

One: As people of faith, joining with all who hunger and thirst for righteousness,

All: We will not be afraid. We will not be silent!

One: Trusting in the Holy One who grants us courage in the struggle for justice and peace,

All: With one voice, one heart, we cry out for justice this day. We move forward together, not one step back!

The Litany reflects Micah 6:8, Amos 5:24, Luke 10:27, Luke 19:39-40; quotes are from Isaiah 10:1-2; Psalm 94:20.
